## "KIDS FOR KING" PROGRAM LAUNCHES TO MARK 1963 MARCH ON WASHINGTON AND 'I HAVE A DREAM' SPEECH

## Celebrities, Athletes, Corporations Help Build Memorial to Dr. King

(August 22, 2005, Washington, DC) -- The Washington, DC Martin Luther King, Jr. National Memorial Project Foundation, Inc. launches the *Kids for King...Share your Dream...Build the Dream* program today to commemorate the 1963 March on Washington. Youth from first through twelfth grades will be asked to help build a memorial to Dr. King on the National Mall.

Program participants will be asked to write an essay about their dream for a better America. Twelve lucky youth will be selected from a random drawing and will be flown to Washington, DC, along with a legal guardian, for the memorial's groundbreaking ceremony in the Fall of 2006.

"I call on the nation's youth to carry on Dr. King's American dream of peace, equality, and justice by helping build the Martin Luther King, Jr. National Memorial," said Harry E. Johnson, Sr., President of the MLK National Memorial Foundation. Several national icons will join the MLK Memorial Foundation launch *Kids for King* including: Hall of Fame player Bill Russell, Co-Founder of Black Entertainment Television and CEO of Salamander Hospitality Sheila C. Johnson, General Motors (GM) Global Group Vice President Gary Cowger, former Motion Picture Association of America (MPAA) President and CEO Jack Valenti, Washington Mystics All-Star player Alana Beard, and veteran broadcast journalist Maureen Bunyan. Youth from the Boys and Girls club will also participate.

"General Motors is proud to serve as the lead sponsor of the Martin Luther King, Jr. National Memorial project," said GM's Gary Cowger. "Keeping Dr. King's legacy alive will provide our young people with further proof that their hope and dreams matter and that each of us can make a tremendous difference."

Washington, DC Martin Luther King, Jr. National Memorial Project Foundation, Inc. A memorial honoring Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. will be built on the National Mall in Washington, D.C. The memorial will be situated adjacent to the F.D.R. Memorial and in a direct line between the Lincoln and Jefferson Memorials. Congress passed Joint Resolutions in 1996 authorizing Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. to establish a memorial honoring Dr. King to be built in Washington, DC. The foundation has raised \$38.5 million out of the needed \$100 million to build the memorial. Groundbreaking is scheduled for late 2006 and the memorial is scheduled to be completed in 2008.
