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MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. MEMORIAL ANNOUNCES \$5 MILLION FUNDRAISING GOAL FOR BLACK HISTORY MONTH

Adds Aggressive Public Phase to "Build the Dream" Campaign

Washington, DC – In celebration of Black History Month, the Martin Luther King, Jr. National Memorial Foundation announces a \$5 million public fundraising goal for the month of February. This will serve as a key component in building the four-acre MLK Memorial on the National Mall in Washington, DC.

All contributors who make a minimum of a \$5 contribution to the Memorial will receive a blue MLK Memorial Foundation “build the dream” bracelet. The Foundation’s Black History Month initiatives also include television and radio PSAs featuring Morgan Freeman, Samaire Armstrong, Bishop Clarence McClendon and Nelly, special events, and promotions with major corporate partners including General Motors, Tommy Hilfiger, Aflac, and Procter and Gamble.

“We are turbo charging the Martin Luther King Memorial campaign -- asking all Americans to become partners in building the Memorial by logging on to www.buildthedream.org or calling 888-4THEDREAM,” said Harry E. Johnson, President of the MLK Memorial Foundation. “Dr. King spoke of ‘the fierce urgency of now’. Here at the foundation, we feel that urgency, and ask for your help by giving whatever you can. Every donation will help us build the dream.”

Contributors will join a rapidly growing list of supporters including all living former U.S. Presidents, Nancy Reagan, and Lady Bird Johnson.
